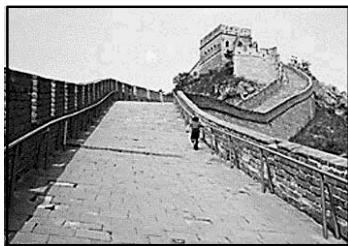


My Wife Still Healing
